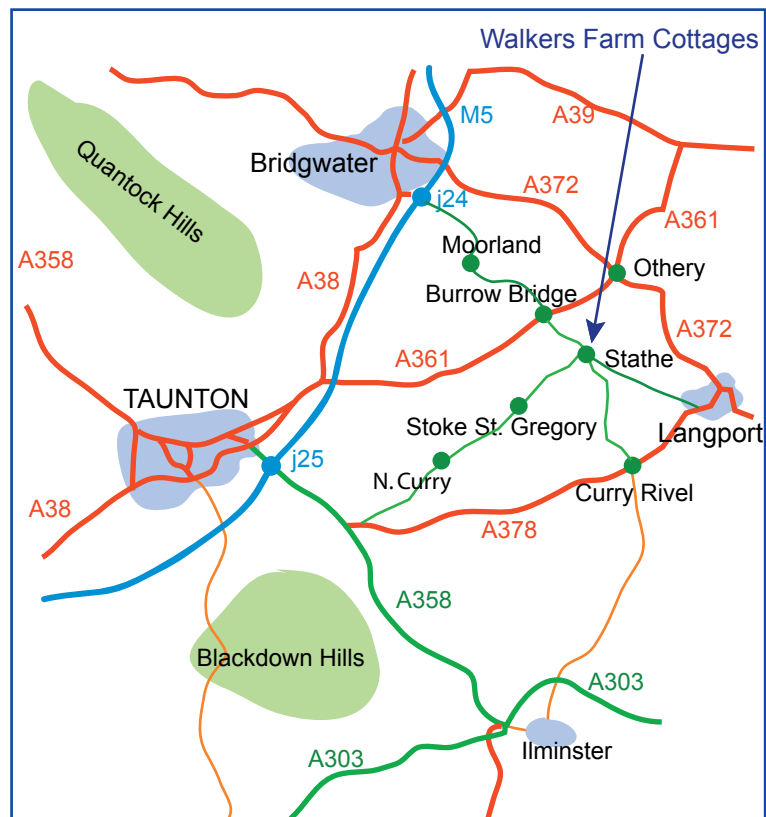


Directions (OS grid ref. ST368286)

Walkers' Farm Cottages lie in the quiet hamlet of Stathe between the villages of Burrowbridge and Stoke St. Gregory. Our nearest towns are Taunton (10 miles), Bridgwater (10 miles), Langport (4 miles) and Street (20 miles).



Exit M5 j 25, A358. Left at lights to Langport, after 200m left to N. Curry and on to Stoke St Gregory. Bear left into Slough lane, continue 2 miles. After railway bridge the farm is the third house on the left with arched barn.

One of the cottages, the Hackney Stable, is fully fitted for wheelchair access with all rooms on one level and no steps or ramps and with a "drive-in" bathroom.

Visit local gardens including Hestercombe, Barrington Court, Montacute House. Walk in the Mendip and Quantock Hills or on Exmoor, or visit Wookey Hole Caves, Wells Cathedral and Glastonbury Tor.

Why not bring your horse to ride on the Quantock Hills or local moors (stabling and grass keep available). Pets by arrangement.

The Hackney Stable

The Hackney Stable was built in 1884 and used for stabling horses and hackney carriages via the central arches.



It is all situated at ground floor level to facilitate wheelchair access. It has a light airy relaxing atmosphere and comes equipped with comfortable sofas and chairs and a fully fitted kitchen with electric cooker, microwave oven, iron, TV, fridge and washing machine.



It offers:

- Wheelchair access with drive-in shower/ WC
- 2 bedrooms (1 double, 1 single) and lounge
- A fully-fitted kitchen
- Oil-fired central heating
- Washing machine
- Patio area and play area for children
- Ample parking
- A quiet environment.



The Old Parlour and the Old Dairy

Two similar cottages. Each sleeps 4 (5) people.

- 2 twin bedrooms (parlour) and 1 double and 1 twin (dairy)
- Each has lounge and fully fitted kitchen
- Shower room downstairs
- Shower and WC upstairs
- Oil-fired central heating
- Washing machine
- Communal dryer and dog kennel
- Garden and play area for children.



The Tallet

- 2 twin bedrooms and a living room (sleeps 4)
- Fully fitted kitchen
- Oil-fired central heating
- Washing machine
- Tumble dryer available
- Play area for children
- Ample parking.



The Tallet is an old Somerset name for a loft where the hay was kept and then thrown down into the hay racks of the horses below. It is situated on the first floor affording magnificent views over Sedgemoor through its large windows. Rooms, with the exception of the bathroom, are similar to those in the Hackney Stable. It has a light airy relaxing atmosphere and comes equipped with comfortable sofas and chairs and a fully fitted kitchen with electric cooker, microwave oven, iron, TV, fridge and washing machine.

Local Attractions

The hamlet of Stathe lies between the villages of Burrowbridge (well-known for its "Burrow Mump") and Stoke St. Gregory (with its Willows and Wetlands Visitor Centre). This area is the heart of the award-winning willow craft industry

where willow is fashioned into baskets and cane furniture. It is also part of the old cider-making area.



Local walks include the River Parrett Trail and MacMillan Way; we keep maps and details of many trails. Walk to one of our local pubs or restaurants in Stoke St. Gregory or North Curry.

Houses and Gardens: Hestercombe, Barrington Court, Montacute.

Sport: Somerset Cricket Club, Taunton Racecourse.

Arts: Brewhouse Theatre, Bridgwater Arts Centre, Tacchi-Morris Centre.

Museums: County Museum, Haynes Motor Museum, Fleet Air Arm.

Days out: Clarks Village, Wookey Hole Caves, Cheddar Gorge and Caves, West Somerset Railway, Dunster Castle, Wells Cathedral, Glastonbury Tor and Abbey, Burnham-on-sea, Cricket St. Thomas wildlife park.
